10. Obligatory memorials of the General Calendar
11. Proper obligatory memorials, namely:
 - a. Memorials of a secondary patron of the place, diocese, region, or of a religious province;
 - b. Other obligatory memorials listed in the calendar of a diocese, religious order or congregation

12. Optional memorials but these may be celebrated even on the days listed in n. 9 above, in the special manner described by the General Instructions of the Roman Missal and of the Liturgy of the Hours.

Likewise, obligatory memorials may be celebrated as optional memorials if they happen to be on a weekday of Lent.

13. Weekdays of Advent up to 16 December inclusive.

Weekdays of Christmas season from 2 January until the Saturday after the Epiphany.

Weekdays of Easter season from Monday after the Octave of Easter until the Saturday before Pentecost, inclusive.

Weekdays in Ordinary Time.

GENERAL NORMS FOR THE LITURGICAL YEAR AND THE CALENDAR [LYC]

The Liturgical Day

1. The liturgical day runs from midnight to midnight. However, the celebration of Sunday and of solemnities begins on the evening of the day before [LYC. 3].
2. **Sunday** is to be regarded as the primordial feast [LYC. 4].

Because of its special importance, the celebration of Sunday gives way only to solemnities and to feasts of the Lord, except that the Sundays of Advent, Lent and Easter seasons have precedence over all Feasts of the Lord and over all solemnities. Solemnities occurring on these Sundays are observed on the Monday following or to the nearest free day, as laid down by the General Norms. However, if a solemnity is impeded by Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday, it is observed on the first free day after the second Sunday of Easter[decision of the Congregation for Divine Worship, dated 22 April 1990, in *Notitiae* 26 (1990) 160].

3. **Solemnities** are regarded as being the most important days in the calendar and their celebration begins with first vespers on the evening of the preceding day. Some Solemnities are also endowed with their own vigil Mass for use when Mass is celebrated on the evening the preceding day [LYC. 11].
4. **Feasts** are celebrated within the limits of the natural day and accordingly they have no first vespers, except in the case of Feasts of the Lord inscribed in the general calendar, that fall on a Sunday of Ordinary Time or in Christmas season and which replace the Sunday Liturgy [LYC. 13].

5. **Memorials** are either obligatory or optional; their observance is integrated into the celebration of the weekday in accordance with the norms set forth in the General Instructions of the Roman Missal and of the Liturgy of the Hours.

Obligatory memorials which fall on weekdays of Lent and between 17 and 31 December may only be celebrated as optional memorials in the following way:

- a. At the Office of Readings, after the prescribed second reading and its responsory, is added the reading of the saint with its responsory and then the prayer of the saint.
- b. At Lauds and Vespers, after the prayer, the conclusion is omitted and the antiphon and prayer of the saint is added.
- c. At Mass that day the collect of the saint may be used, provided the saint is inscribed in the General Roman calendar.

If several optional memorials fall on the same day, only one may be celebrated; the others are omitted [LYC. 14].

6. **Saturdays** in Ordinary Time when no obligatory memorial occurs, an optional memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary is permitted [LYC.15].
7. **Weekdays:** The days of the week that follow Sunday are referred to as weekdays. However, they are celebrated differently according to the importance of each [LYC. 16].
- a. Ash Wednesday and the days of Holy Week, from Monday to Thursday inclusive, are preferred to all other celebrations.

- b. The weekdays of Advent from December 17 to December 24 inclusive and all the weekdays of Lent take precedence over obligatory memorials.
- c. All other weekdays yield to solemnities and feasts and are combined with memorials [LYC. 16].

When several celebrations coincide

- 8. If several celebrations fall on the same day, the one that holds the highest rank according to the Table of Liturgical Days is observed [LYC. 60].
- 9. If a solemnity is impeded, in any given year by a liturgical day that takes precedence over it, it should be transferred to the nearest day, which is not a day listed in nn. 1–8 of the Tables given above.

Any other celebrations that are impeded are omitted for that year.

- 10. Should vespers of the current day's Office and first vespers of the following day be assigned for celebration on the same day, then vespers of the celebration with the higher rank in the Table of Liturgical Days takes precedence; in cases of equal rank, vespers of the current day take precedence [LYC. 61].

'Outward celebration'

- 14. For the pastoral good of the faithful, it is permitted to observe on Sundays of Ordinary Time those celebrations that fall during the week and that are agreeable to the devotion of the faithful, provided the celebrations rank above that Sunday in the Table of Liturgical Days. The Mass of such celebrations may be used at all the Masses at which the people are present [LYC. 58].

CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

The Different Forms of Celebration

1. When a Bishop presides

In the local Church, prime place should be given to the Mass at which the bishop presides surrounded by his presbyterium and ministers and in which the people participate fully and actively, for it is there that the principal manifestation of the Church is found [IM 112].

2. Parish Community Mass

Great importance should also be attached to a Mass celebrated with any community, but especially with the parish community, in as much as it represents the universal Church at a given time and place, chiefly in the common Sunday celebration [IM 113].

3. Concelebrated Masses

Concelebration of the Eucharist aptly expresses the unity of the sacrifice and of the priesthood and whenever the faithful take an active part, the unity of the people of God stands out in a particular fashion, especially if the bishop presides.

Concelebration also symbolizes and strengthens the fraternal bond between priests, because by virtue of the ordination to the priesthood and the priestly mission that they have in common, all priests are linked together in a close bond of brotherhood.

For this reason, unless the needs of the faithful (which always must be considered with great pastoral concern) prevent it, and without prejudice to the faculty of every

priest to celebrate Mass individually, it is highly appropriate that priests celebrate Mass in this excellent manner either in communities of priests, in groups meeting at regular intervals, or in other similar circumstances. Those who live in community or minister at the same church should gladly welcome visiting priests to concelebrate with them. Superiors should therefore facilitate this and indeed encourage concelebration whenever pastoral needs or another reasonable cause do not demand otherwise [Instruction *Eucharistic Mystery*, No. 47].

4. Mass for the People

The Parish Priest [and the one who is bound by the same duties and possesses the same rights as a Parish Priest], once he has taken possession of his parish, he is bound, on each Sunday and on each Holyday of obligation in his diocese to celebrate the Mass for the people entrusted to him. If he is lawfully impeded in this, he should have someone else celebrate Mass for the people on these days or else celebrate it himself on other days.

A Parish Priest who has the care of several parishes is bound to apply only one Mass on the days mentioned above, for all the people entrusted to him [Cf.Can.534, 540].

5. Nuptial Mass

Whenever marriage is celebrated within Mass, the Mass for Spouses is used, along with white vestments. If, however, the celebration coincides with a day listed in nn. 1–4 of the Table of Liturgical Days, the Mass of the

day is used with its own proper readings, plus the nuptial blessing and if appropriate the final blessing of the wedding Mass.

If, however, in the Christmas season, or in Ordinary Time, the sacrament of marriage is celebrated within a Mass at which the parish community participates, the Sunday Mass is used.

Since, however, the Liturgy of the Word is of great moment in the celebration of marriage for a catechesis regarding the sacrament and the duties conferred upon the spouses, in cases where the Mass for Spouses is not used, **one of the readings may be taken from among those provided for the celebration of marriage** [OM, 34].

If marriage is celebrated on a day of penitential character, especially within Lent, the parish priest should advise that account be taken of that character. The celebration of marriage on Good Friday and on the day following, Holy Saturday, is absolutely forbidden [OM, 32].

6. **Masses for the Dead** [GIRM 379 – 385]

First place among Masses for the Dead is held by the funeral Mass, which may be celebrated on any day except on holydays of obligation, on Maundy Thursday, during the Paschal Triduum, or on the Sundays of the Advent, Lent and Easter seasons.

If the funeral Mass is combined directly with the funeral rite, once the prayer after communion has been said, omitting the concluding rites of Mass, the rite of final commendation and farewell is enacted. This is not to

be done unless the body is actually present. It is appropriate that the paschal candle be placed lit near the bier.

On reception of news of a death, on the occasion of a final burial, or on the *first* anniversary, a Mass for the Dead may be used even on days within the Christmas Octave, and on an obligatory memorial, or on other weekdays, other than on Ash Wednesday or within Holy Week.

Daily Masses of the Dead, unless some real need of the faithful dictates otherwise, are permitted only on weekdays in Ordinary Time, and on optional memorials or days when the weekday Office is used, provided too that the Mass is actually said for the dead.

In Masses for the Dead, purple vestments should be preferred to black ones. The playing of the organ and other musical instruments is allowed only for the purposes of supporting the singing [CB, 252].

7. Anticipated Celebration of Festive Mass on the Previous Evening

The obligation of assisting at the Sunday or feast day Mass may be satisfied by participating at Mass on the feast itself or at evening Mass on the previous day [CCL canon 1248, 1].

An evening Mass celebrated with the aim of satisfying the obligation of the Sunday or feast day following will be arranged with all the elements of a Sunday or feast day Mass, whether obligatory [homily, prayer of the faithful] or recommended [amplifier participation of the people through singing, etc. IM, 115–116].

In choosing Mass formularies the general principle is to be followed of giving precedence to the celebration which is of obligation, regardless of the liturgical grade of the two occurring celebrations [Congregation for Divine Worship, in *Notitiae* 20 (1984) 603].

8. Regarding Various Parts of the Celebration

The Gloria is said:

- a. On Sundays outside Advent and Lent
- b. On Solemnities and Feasts
- c. On days within the Octaves of Christmas and Easter
- d. On days of special solemn celebrations [IM, 53].

The Gloria is not said:

- a. On ferial days, not even of Christmas season or Paschal season
- b. On memorials of saints

9. **Only one Collect or opening presidential prayer of the day is said**, and this applies also to the prayer over the gifts and that after communion.

Prayers for any particular need or the remembrance of any anniversary are to be made in the Prayer of the Faithful.

Readings from the Sacred Scriptures

10. **Sundays:** There are three readings – one from the OT, one from the Letters of the Apostles, and the third from

the Gospels. It is highly desirable that the three should be read. Only two readings may be had for pastoral reasons and if the Bishop's Conference so decides.

11. **Weekdays:** There are readings laid down for every day in all the weeks of the whole year. These readings should be used for the day to which they are assigned unless there occurs a solemnity, a feast or else a memorial that has its own proper readings.
12. **Special Groups:** In Masses for special groups it is permissible for the priest to choose readings more appropriate to the group, provided that the **readings are taken from among those of the approved lectionary** [IM, 358]
- 13 **Chants between the readings:** When there are three readings of Sacred Scripture –
 - a. After the 1st reading, the responsorial Psalm is sung or recited.
 - b. After the 2nd reading, either the Alleluia or the verse before the Gospel is used, depending on the liturgical season.

The Creed is said:

- a. Sundays
- b. Solemnities
- c. On days of special celebration of a more solemn nature.

Regarding Stipend for Masses to be received by the Priest

14. "Separate Masses must be applied for the intentions of those for whom an individual offering, even if small, has been made and accepted" [Can. 948]. Therefore, the priest who accepts a stipend for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention, is bound *in justice* to fulfill that obligation either by himself or by committing it to another priest, observing at the same time the conditions laid down by the Canon Law ([C. 948-949, 954-955]).

Priests can celebrate the Mass which is called *collective*, provided the many people who offer are explicitly informed beforehand that their stipend, together with the offering of stipends of others, will be put together for one Mass. He has also to give them the reason for this arrangement and obtain their free and willing consent. It is also the priest's duty to publish the place and the time of celebrating this Mass, at most twice in a week. The celebrant in this case can retain only the stipend fixed in the diocese. The amount remaining over and above this stipend is to be remitted to the Ordinary, who has to spend it for the purpose determined by the law [CC. 496, 950-951].

THE LITURGY OF THE HOURS

1. Bishops, priests and deacons who aspire to the priesthood have received a mandate from the Church to celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours and should complete all the Hours each day, and in so far as possible at the proper times of the day.

Due importance should be given especially to those Hours which are so to speak the hinge of the Divine Office, namely Lauds and Vespers, the morning and evening Hours. These should not be omitted without a serious reason.

Likewise, the Office of Readings, which is above all a liturgical celebration of the Word of God, should be faithfully completed, so in a special way they may fulfill their own sacred function, receiving themselves the Word of God, by which they may become more perfect disciples of the Lord and may know more deeply the unfathomable riches of Christ.

In this way, they should better sanctify the whole day, having at heart also the recitation of the Middle Hours and also Compline, by which before going to bed they should complete the whole Divine Office and commend themselves to God [IH, 29].

2. Cathedral and collegiate chapters should celebrate in choir those parts of the Liturgy of the Hours stipulated for them by general and local law.

The individual member of such chapters is bound to recite privately in addition to the Hours laid down for all sacred ministers, also those Hours that are incumbent upon his chapter [IH, 31 a].

3. Religious communities are bound to the recitation of the Liturgy of the Hours and each individual religious should celebrate the Hours according to their particular law, without prejudice to what pertains to sacred orders for those who have received them [IH, 31 b].

The Arrangement of the Liturgy of the Hours

4. The Office is to be recited in choir and in common according to the proper calendar, that of the diocese, that is to say, or that of the religious family or of the particular church [IH, 241; LYC 52 c].

In private recitation by the individual, the calendar of the place may be followed or else the proper calendar, except on solemnities and feasts [IH, 243].

5. **On Sundays** [IH, 204–207]

- a. Everything is done as in the Ordinary, in the Psalter and in the Proper, according to the varying seasons.
- b. Both First Vespers and Second Vespers are recited.
- c. At the Office of Readings, after the second reading and its responsory, is said the Hymn *Te Deum*, except in Lent.

6. **On Solemnities** [IH, 225–230]

- a. At First Vespers, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common.
- b. The Compline that follows First Vespers is that laid down for recitation after First Vespers of Sunday.
- c. At the Office of Readings, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common and the Hymn *Te Deum* is always said.
- d. At Lauds, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common, using also the psalms of Sunday Week I.
- e. At the Middle Hours:

- i. The hymn is taken from the Ordinary;
- ii. The antiphon, the short reading, the versicle and response and the prayer are taken from the Proper or the Common
- iii. The psalms:
 - if particular psalms are laid down for a solemnity, these are to be recited at one of the Middle Hours; those who recite the other two Middle Hours that day take the psalms from the supplementary series to be found at the end of the Psalter;
 - if no particular psalms are laid down for a solemnity which occurs on a Sunday, at one of the Middle Hours the psalms recited are taken from those given for Sunday Week I; those who recite the other two Middle Hours that day take the psalms from the supplementary series;
 - in other cases, all the psalms are taken from the supplementary series.
- f. At second Vespers, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common.
- g. The Compline that follows Second Vespers is that laid down for recitation after Second Vespers of Sunday.

7. On Feasts [IH, 231–233]

- a. First Vespers are recited only on Feasts of the Lord inscribed in the general calendar which fall on a Sunday [cf. Table of Liturgical Days, n.5 – pg. vi].

In this case the Compline that follows First Vespers is that laid down for recitation after First Vespers of Sunday.

- b. At the Office of Readings, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common and the Hymn Te Deum is always said.
 - c. At Lauds, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common, using also the psalms of Sunday Week I.
 - d. At the Middle Hour:
 - the hymn is taken from the Ordinary;
 - the short reading, the versicle and response and the prayer are taken from the Proper or the Common.
 - at one of these Middle Hours the antiphons (unless there are proper ones) and the psalms are taken from of the current day of the week; those who recite the other two Middle Hours that day take the psalms from the supplementary series.
 - e. At Vespers, everything is taken from the Proper or the Common;
 - f. Compline is that laid down for that particular day of the week.
8. **On Memorials** [IH, 220, 234–236]
- a. At Lauds, Vespers and the Office of Readings:
 - the psalms and their antiphons are those of the weekday;

N.B. If the memorial has proper antiphons for Lauds, these are used together with the psalms of Sunday Week I; if there are proper antiphons for Vespers, these are used together with psalms from the Common.

- as to the antiphon at the invitatory, the hymns, the short readings with their versicle and response, the Benedictus and Magnificat antiphons, and the intercessions:
- if there are proper texts, those of the memorial are used; otherwise they may be taken either from the Common or from the particular weekday;
- the prayer is also that of the memorial.

b. At the Office of Readings:

- the biblical reading and its responsory is taken from the present season;
- the second reading is of the saint, with its proper responsory, or from the Common, but in the absence of a proper reading concerning the saint, the reading is taken from the weekday;
- the Hymn Te Deum is never said.

c. At the Middle Hour or Terce, Sext and None, and at Compline, everything is taken from the weekday.

9. On Weekdays

- a. Everything is taken from the Ordinary, from the Psalter, and from the Proper, according to the season.

- b. at the Office of Readings, the Hymn Te Deum is never said.
- c. the prayer at the Office of Readings is taken from the Proper, at the other Hours during Ordinary Time it is taken from the Psalter, and at other seasons from the Proper.

DAYS OF PENANCE

1. The days and times of penance for all the Latin Church are each Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent.
2. Abstinence from meat, or from some other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, except when a solemnity falls on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. All are bound by the law of abstinence who have reached the age of fourteen. The law of fasting applies to all who have attained their majority until after their fifty-ninth birthday. Pastors of souls and parents should ensure that even those who are still too young to be bound by the laws of fasting and abstinence are trained to have a true appreciation of penance.
4. The Episcopal Conference can lay down more particular norms regarding the practice of fasting and abstinence. It may also substitute, either in whole or in part, other forms of penance, above all works of charity and devotional exercises, in place of abstinence or fasting.

Advent has a twofold character. It is firstly a season to prepare for Christmas, when Christ's first coming to us is remembered, and secondly a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. Advent is thus a period of devout and joyful expectation [LYC 39].

During Advent, the playing of the organ and other musical instruments and the decoration of the altar with flowers should be done in a moderate manner, as is consonant with the character of the season, without anticipating the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord.

The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of Matrimony.

ORDINARY TIME

Before Lent

The Church celebrates the paschal mystery on the first day of each week, known as the Lord's Day or Sunday. This follows a tradition handed down from the Apostles and its origin from the day of Christ's resurrection. Thus, Sunday must be ranked as the first Eucharistic day of all. [GNLY 4].

The Sundays of this season do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Instead, they are added to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.

Note: On any weekday '*in the year*', when the Mass is of *choice*, the Proper Mass can choose any of the Masses found in the Missal, except the Ritual Masses. The following should be taken into account

- a) The Proper Mass has to pay attention first to the spiritual Good of the people, not his own ideas.
- b) Ordinary Masses for the dead will be celebrated moderately since Mass is offered for both the living and the dead.

LENT

Season of Lent:

Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. For the Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery: catechumens, through the several stages of Christian initiation; the faithful, through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices.

Holy Week, which begins on the 6th Sunday of Lent, Passion [Palm] Sunday, has as its purpose the remembrance of Christ's passion, beginning with his Messianic entrance into Jerusalem.

Notes for the Season:

1. All 'Alleluias' are omitted until the EASTER VIGIL
2. The Proper Mass and the Preface of Lent is said
3. In Mass of weekdays, the Opening prayer may be replaced by the Proper of the Saint whose commemoration occurs on that day.

Notes for Ash Wednesday:

1. Day of Fast and Abstinence
2. At Mass, no Rite of Penance. The Ashes are blessed and distributed after the Gospel and Homily
3. Outside Mass, Ashes may be blessed and distributed after a Liturgy of the Word with prayers and readings of the day.

HOLY WEEK

In Holy week the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his earthly life, from his messianic entry into Jerusalem until his blessed Passion and Glorious Resurrection. Lent continues until Holy Thursday.

Notes:

General: The rite of the blessing of Palms, the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Maundy Thursday, the Good Friday Liturgical Service and the Easter VIGIL may be celebrated in all Churches and public or semi-public Oratories. If they cannot be conducted with enough dignity [servers, singing, participating faithful], it is better to have them only in Parish Churches.

For Palm Sunday:

- a) Red vestments for all ceremonies today
- b) Christ's entry into Jerusalem may be recalled as a Procession, a Solemn Entrance or a Simple Entrance. The Solemn Entrance may be repeated but not the Proper Mass Procession.
- c) No Blessing of Palms without Mass, the celebrant must be the same for both.
- d) At the Procession or Solemn Entrance, the Mass begins with the Opening prayer of the day.
- e) Lay readers may proclaim the Gospel of the Passion; Preferably a Priest should take the part of Christ.

THE “PASCHAL TRIDUUM”

Note:

Easter Triduum:

Begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter VIGIL and concludes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.

Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect Glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. Therefore, the Easter Triduum of the Passion and

Resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. The Solemnity of Easter has the kind of pre-eminence in the year that Sunday has in the week.

Notes:

- a) Masses without people are not allowed. On Maundy Thursday Evening, for pastoral reasons the Ordinary may allow one or two Masses besides the main Mass of the Lord's Supper
- b) On Maundy Thursday Holy Communion may be distributed only during the Mass.
- c) On Good Friday only during the Liturgical Service. But Communion may be brought to the sick on both days.
- d) On Holy Saturday, Communion may be given only as viaticum.
- e) On Thursday and Friday, Vespers may be omitted by those who participate in the Liturgical Service of the day. Those who participate in the Easter VIGIL may omit the Saturday Compline and the Office of Readings of Easter Sunday.

Notes:

- a) The Celebration of the Passion of the Lord must be held at a convenient hour after noontime, usually around 3.00 p.m. For pastoral reasons, however, it may be held at a later hour.
- b) At the beginning, the Altar must be bare – without linen, candles or cross.
- c) Holy Communion is to be distributed to the faithful only within the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord. It may however, be distributed at any hour of the day to the sick who are unable to participate in the Liturgy.
- d) After the celebration of the Passion of the Lord, the Blessed Sacrament is to be taken back in a simple form to the place of reservation. There it is to be reserved as is the custom with a lamp lit. The Altar is bare. Now, however, the cross and the candles may be left on it.
- e) Today after the unveiling of the Cross and tomorrow until the Easter VIGIL begins, we bow/genuflect to the Cross.
- f) Collection is for the maintenance of the Sacred Places in the Holy Land.

20 Saturday **HOLY SATURDAY**

Note:

The Liturgy of the Hours is celebrated with the special features indicated in the Proper Mass of Time. Holy Communion may not be distributed today before the Easter VIGIL, except as Viaticum.

THE EASTER SEASON:

The Easter Season begins with celebration of the Easter on Easter Sunday and concludes 50 days later with Pentecost Sunday. The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one Easter day, or better as one 'Great Sunday' These are above all others the days for the singing of the Alleluia.

Notes for the Season

- a) The Easter Candle is kept near the altar or the lectern. It is lit at all Masses during the Octave and on all Sunday Masses of the Easter Season
- b) On weekdays, during the Masses of the Season, Votive masses and daily Masses for the dead are not allowed except for pastoral reasons. But the Mass of the Saint whose Memorial occurs on that day may be celebrated.

Notes for the Easter VIGIL

- a) The entire Liturgical Service is celebrated at night
- b) There is no 'service followed by Mass' But the Liturgy of the Eucharist is part of the entire VIGIL Service. The faithful must clearly be instructed on this point.
- c) The celebration of Mass without the Easter VIGIL Service is not allowed.
- d) For the entire Liturgical action, the Sacred Ministers dress in White vestments.

- e) In case of necessity, the Easter proclamation [Exsultet] may be sung by a cantor who is not a deacon. In this case the blessing of the deacon is omitted.
- f) Priests who celebrate or concelebrate at the VIGIL Service may celebrate or concelebrate again on Easter Sunday. The faithful may similarly receive Communion again.

ORDINARY TIME [AFTER PENTECOST] 2019

The Church celebrates the paschal mystery on the first day of each week, known as the Lord's Day or Sunday. This follows a tradition handed down from the Apostles and having its origin from the day of Christ's resurrection. Thus, Sunday must be ranked as the first Easter day of all [GNLY 4].

The Sundays of this season do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Instead, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.

Pastors should take care that in the liturgy not only are the laws governing valid and lawful celebration are observed, but also that the faithful take part with full awareness and in active and fruitful participation [SC, 11].

Since the celebration of the Eucharist, like the entire liturgy, proceeds by means of tangible signs that foster, strengthen and give expression to faith, the utmost care must be taken to choose and to arrange those forms and elements provided by the Church, which in the given circumstances of persons and places will best foster active and full participation and best meet the spiritual needs of the faithful [IM, 20].
